"Alleluia! Alleluia! He has risen as He said, Alleluia! Alleluia!"

Easter celebrates one of the central mysteries of our faith – Jesus rose from the dead. God shows that He is the Messiah sent for the world's salvation.

On Easter Vigil, we sing the Exultet with our hearts out, joyfully proclaiming that the light of God is fill-

ing the farthest bounds of the earth and claiming all the darkness in our hearts. Salvation and eternal life have been won for us through Jesus Christ.

The locked doors of the Upper Room cannot contain the joy the apostles felt of Christ's resurrection. It seeks its way out to reach weary and dark hearts. It seeps through walls hardened by doubt or suffering. And it ought to remain in our hearts until the fullness of time.

Where can we find this Easter joy in this time of financial crisis, war and human conflicts, and the intensifying "natural" calamities everywhere? Where can I find this Easter joy as your new priest amid the parish community's challenges? Will our thunderous cheers of Alleluia be short-lived, and will we find ourselves jeering again with the Good Friday crowd? Will all these dampen our Easter spirit and make us feel uncertain about where to go and what to do?

We must be reminded of the Easter joy that sustained the disciples in their faith journey — joy that any life circumstances could not rob — the ultimate joy brought about by Jesus in His death and resurrection.

This same joy is a grace that will carry us through our life's journey as we face hardships, challenges, and tribulations. This same joy should bring us together and unify us as a parish community. This same joy should lead us to proclaim Christ in our community and the wider society. This same joy should be expressed in our ministries towards our society's poor and less fortunate. This same joy should launch us into participating and continuing the works of Jesus in building God's kingdom in our community.

Let us strive to live as a song of thanksgiving to God. Let our participation in the life of the church (our ministries) be an authentic witness to our gratitude to God for the joy of salvation.

"Surrexit Dominus vere! Alleluia!"

Easter delves into the core of salvation history and divine mercy. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 647) states that Jesus' resurrection is the fulfilment of the promises of the Old Testament and the foundation of our faith. Easter reveals the victory of life over death, light over darkness, and good over evil. Through Christ's sacrificial death on the cross and subsequent resurrection, the Catholic Church believes that humanity is redeemed from sin and offered the gift of eternal life. This truth is emphasized in St. Paul's letters, particularly in 1 Corin-
